The Regina Caeli

During the Easter Season, the Church prays thrice daily the “Regina Caeli” in place of the “Angelus” at 6 AM, Noon and 6 PM, a centuries-old tradition marked by the ringing of parish church bells during the prayer.

The “Regina Caeli” is a prayer celebrating Christ’s Resurrection while the “Angelus” celebrates Christ’s Incarnation announced by the Archangel Gabriel to Our Lady.

V. Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.

R. For He whom you merited to bear, alleluia.

V. Has risen, as He said, alleluia.

R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, Alleluia.

R. For the Lord is truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray: O God, Who gave joy to the world through the Resurrection of thy Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.
